What do the Scholarships provide?

The NBMBAA, Xerox Canada Ltd. Scholarship (the “Scholarship”) will be awarded as follows:

1. A one-time, non-renewable, Graduate Scholarship of **\$3,000** to a visible minority MBA Candidate enrolled in the 1st or 2nd year of their MBA Program, a paid internship at Xerox Canada Ltd., mentorship by a NBMBAA member, and a 1 year NBMBAA student membership.
2. A one-time, non-renewable, Undergraduate Scholarship of **\$3,000** to a visible minority Undergraduate student enrolled in any year of a 4 year business undergraduate degree, a paid internship at Xerox Canada Ltd., mentorship by a NBMBAA member, and a 1 year NBMBAA student membership.

The objective of the scholarships, associated internships and mentoring programs is to encourage high performing diverse men and women to complete their studies, gain skills and work experience that can provide a platform from which to launch their careers.

Eligibility Criteria

- Students from a self-identified visible minority group who are eligible to work in Canada.
- Students enrolled in a full time business degree (undergraduate or graduate), program at a Canadian university for the academic year commencing in the year in which the scholarship application is submitted. Students commencing their studies in the Fall are eligible.
- Awardees must be available to complete a 4-month internship during a mutually agreed term following the award and prior to the completion of their studies.

Selection Criteria

- High academic achievement.
- Recognized contribution to the community.
- Demonstrated leadership skills.

Application Requirements

- A completed application form (photocopied forms are acceptable). Completion of Part I and the 8 questions in Part II of the application.

- Two passport size photos once the Scholarship has been awarded– head shots (once submitted these photos will be the property of the NBMBAA Scholarship Fund).

1a. Undergraduate business students are required to write a 500-word essay on the subject: **“Why I should win the Xerox Canada Ltd. Undergraduate Scholarship for Diversity & Innovation.”**

1b. Graduate business students are required to write a 500 word essay on the subject: **“Why I should win the Xerox Canada Ltd. Graduate Scholarship for Diversity & Innovation.”**

2. Describe your past/current participation in your community and what motivated that involvement. Include one or more occasions where you demonstrated leadership and indicate the outcome.

3. Give an example of a situation where you have been/had the opportunity to use information technology to achieve a specific goal.

4. What would you like to gain from the internship and professional mentors?

5. Are you available to complete a 4-month internship between January 2011 and December 2011, prior to the completion of your program?

6. Submit a resume highlighting your academic success, work experience, extracurricular activities, and any awards or citations you have received.

7. Provide an academic transcript and two (2) letters of references. One must be a teacher from your high school, university or graduate school. The other must be from an individual, other than your teacher or a family member, who is familiar with your community service, leadership abilities or work experience.

8. Sign the attached consent form which allows us to collect and use your personal information in the promotion of the NBMBAA Xerox Scholarship.
